Value 6 categories of light

Objective

This assignment introduces you to how light and shadow can describe a form or space.

Time to complete this assignment:

Plan to spend 5 to 7 hours on this assignment.

- Demonstrate ability to create a value scale
- Exhibit skill in depicting and identifying the 6 categories of light
- Demonstrate the ability to utilize continuous tone to describe forms and planes

Materials

Must be hand drawn; suggested materials include (choose one of the following):

- Graphite pencils (such as ebony or woodless pencil)
- white drawing paper (such as white sulphite paper or Strathmore drawing pad)
- Charcoal (vine charcoal, charcoal pencils)

Also, blending stumps, erasers, chamois or soft tissue.

Assignment

 This video is an introduction to value and how to create a value scale.

 - Complete a value scale with 10 values that range incrementally from white to black. You may use charcoal or graphite. See the demo video above.
 - 2. Draw an egg that has been placed on a white sheet of paper. Try to have a single light source, if possible. Values should transition slowly---no outlines! You may need to darken the negative space to define edges. See the demo video above. Take a reference photo of your egg from the same vantage point. Take a photo of your drawing in daylight---this is very important and label the 6 categories of light. See the Sample submission.
 - 3. Draw one of the following:
 - a simple paper lunch bag or grocery bag. Ignore any writing on it.
 - Value-Paper bag demo planes defined by light
 - a single sheet of white paper, either crumpled or folded (origami, perhaps?)

Try to place a single light source on your object. Take a reference photo, and take a photo of your finished drawing in daylight. Again, this is very important! Value-crumpled paper opens in new window demo defining the planes

• Submit value scale, reference photo and finished egg, and crumpled paper/paper bag drawings to submission link in Brightspace. Be sure to take your photos in daylight.
