



Artist Profile Page Project

This project builds directly from your Choose Your Artist discussion post. After sharing and narrowing down your artist options in the discussion, you'll now create a 1–2 page “Profile Page” that interprets your chosen artist’s information in a creative, social media–inspired format.

Think of it like making a condensed social media profile, fan page, or artist card. Clear, engaging, and visually interesting. You may design it in PowerPoint, Word, Canva, Google Docs, or any program you're comfortable with, **but your final submission must be saved as a PDF.**

Task 1: Choose an Artist

Choose one of the artists from your Discussion Post (Choose Your Artist) list or suggestion from classmate’s replies.

- You must choose a living artist (or very recently deceased). Even more fun if you can find a local artist and can include a firsthand interview!
- Select a predominately visual artist whose work appeals to you.
- The artist can be a cross-disciplinary creator, as long as a substantial portion of their work includes visual arts.

Task 2: Create a Profile Page

AI Use Statement: You may not use generative AI on this assignment

Requirements (All Must Be Included):

1. Artist Info (Bio Section)
 - a. Artist’s full name.
 - b. Place/date of birth (and death if applicable).
 - c. Artistic discipline(s).
 - d. Key milestones or recognitions.
 - e. Artistic education (if applicable).

2. Artwork Showcase

- a. 3–6 artworks (images included).
- b. Each image labeled with: *Title (italicized)*, Medium, Dimensions, Date, and Location (if known).

3. Themes & Concepts

- a. A short paragraph (5–7 sentences) about the recurring themes, ideas, or concepts the artist explores.
- b. How do their experiences influence their work?
- c. What emotions or ideas are they trying to evoke?

4. Techniques & Influences

- a. A short bulleted list of the artist's techniques, styles, materials, and influences (such as movements, mentors, or cultural context).

5. Personal Reflection

- a. 1 short paragraph explaining:
- b. Why you chose this artist.
- c. What about their work connects to or inspires you.

6. Sources

- a. At least 3 credible sources (MLA format). These may include museum or gallery websites, the artist's website, interviews, or published articles/books.

Format / Creative Twist

- Style the page like a social media profile, artist fan page, or creative poster. It's your creative choice!
- Include images, headings, and formatting to make it visually appealing.
- Keep it 1–2 pages max.

Submit: A PDF file.
